Frantz (12A)

Dir. François Ozon. France/Germany, 2016. 1h 54m. French/German/subs. Starring Pierre Niney, Paula Beer, Ernst Stötzner. After WW1, a young German woman mourning her fiancé's death forms a bond with a mysterious Frenchman who has placed flowers on her beloved's grave. A moving tale of romance, grief and guilt that is shot in stunning black and white.



Mindhorn (15)

Dir. Sean Foley. UK, 2016. 1h 29m. Starring Julian Barratt, Russell Tovey, Kenneth Branagh, Steve Coogan, Essie Davis, Andrea Riseborough, Simon Farnaby. Off the wall British comedy about a washed-up 1980s TV detective who's called in to help with a real-life crime case. Julian Barrett (*The Mighty Boosh*) stars in this laugh-out-loud funny and self-deprecating sleuth spoof.



Lady Macbeth (15)

Dir. William Oldroyd. UK, 2016. 1h 29m. Starring Florence Pugh, Cosmo Jarvis, Naomi Ackie. Florence Pugh gives a captivating performance as a young bride married off to a bitter old landowner in a chilling period drama set in 19th-century rural England. Domestic tensions intensify when she begins a passionate affair with a young estate worker.

Dir. David Bickerstaff. Italy, 2017. 1h 31m. Starring Jonathan Jones, Arnold Nesselrath, Martin Gayford. Journey through the chapels, print rooms and museums of Florence, Rome and the Vatican in this fascinating documentary exploring the life and work of Michelangelo.

Miss Sloane (15)

Dir John Madden. USA, 2016. 2h 12m. Starring Jessica Chastain, Mark Strong, Michael Stuhlbarg, Gugu Mbatha-Raw, Christine Baranski, Alison Pill. A formidable Washington lobbyist goes head-to-head against a powerful gun lobby in an attempt to pass gun control legislation. John Madden's slick political thriller features an absorbing lead performance by Jessica Chastain.



Alien: Covenant (15)

Dir. Ridley Scott. USA, 2017. 2h 2m. Starring Katherine Waterston, Michael Fassbender, Billy Crudup, Danny McBride. The crew of a colony ship land on an uncharted planet which seems to be a hidden paradise, capable of sustaining human life. What could possibly go wrong? Ridley Scott ratchets up the tension and the terror in an exhilarating addition to the Alien saga.



The Levelling (15)

Dir. Hope Dickson Leach. UK, 2016. 1h 24m. Starring Ellie Kendrick, David Troughton, Jack Holden, Joe Blakemore. Following the death of her brother, a young woman returns home to find the family farm devastated by floods. A hauntingly lyrical social-realist drama that sees writer/director Hope Dickson Leach's first feature living up to the promise of her early short films.

Citizen Jane: Battle for the City (PG)

Dir. Matt Tyrnauer. USA, 2016. 1h 33m. The Other Side of Hope (12A)

Dir. Aki Kaurismäki. Finland, 2017. 1h 40m. Finnish/Arabic/subs. Starring Sherwan Haji, Sakari Kuosmanen, Janne Hyytiäinen, Tommi Korpela. A hilarious poker-faced comedy directed by the Scandinavian master of deadpan humour. A Syrian asylum seeker escapes from a Finnish detention centre and forms an unlikely friendship with an elderly restaurant owner.



Colossal (15)

Dir. Nacho Vigalondo. Canada, 2016. 1h 49m. Starring Anne Hathaway, Jason Sudeikis, Austin Stowell, Tim Blake Nelson, Dan Stevens, Sarah Surh. An out-of-work party-girl discovers a mysterious connection between herself and a monster wreaking havoc on the other side of the globe. Anne Hathaway is brilliant in this funny and peculiar indie rom-com kaiju mash-up.



Inversion (PG)

Dir. Behnam Behzadi. Iran, 2016. 1h 25m. Persian/subs. Starring Alireza Aghakhani, Sahar Dolatshahi, Roya Javidnia. A young woman rails against her family after being told she must leave Tehran due to the increasing levels of air pollution affecting her mother's health. A quietly compelling Iranian drama about a woman who is not as liberated as she thinks she is.

The Red Turtle (PG)

Dir. Michael Dudok de Wit. France/Belgium, 2016. 1h 21m. Starring Emmanuel Garjo, Tom Hudson, Baptiste Goy, Axel Devillers, Barbara Beretta. Gorgeous hand-drawn animation about a man living his life stranded on a tropical island. Studio Ghibli's first-ever international co-production was nominated for Best Animation at the Oscars.



I Am Not Madame Bovary (12A)

Dir. Xiaogang Feng. China, 2016. 2h 19m. Mandarin/subs. Starring Bingbing Fan, Wei Fan, Tao Guo. Acclaimed director Feng Xiaogang's razor-sharp satirical comedy lampooning the absurdity of Chinese bureaucracy. After being swindled by her ex-husband, a café proprietor spends a decade petitioning the Chinese legal system and plotting her revenge.



Machines (12A)

Dir. Rahul Jain. India, 2016. 1h 11m. Hindi/subs. Mesmerising documentary which provides a glimpse into the heavily guarded world of Indian sweatshops. The film shows the shameful working conditions as well as the huge divide between rich and poor through interviews with the workers and the owner.

Dir. Federico Fellini. Italy, 1955. 1h 48m. Italian/subs. Starring Anthony Quinn, Giulietta Masina, Richard Basehart, Aldo Silvani, Marcella Rovere. New restoration of Fellini's Oscar-winning tale of a young woman sold by her mother to a boorish circus strongman to be both his wife and assistant as he tours central Italy.
