Saltburn (15)

Dir. Emerald Fennell. UK, 2023. 2h 11m. Starring Barry Keoghan, Jacob Elordi, Rosamund Pike, Richard E. Grant, Carey Mulligan. Struggling to fit in at Oxford University, a student is drawn into the world of a charming aristocratic classmate, who invites him to stay at his family estate for the summer. Barry Keoghan leads an incredible ensemble cast in Emerald Fennell's (*Promising Young Woman*) wicked comedy satirising privilege, status, and desire.

The Eternal Daughter (12A)

Dir. Joanna Hogg. UK, 2022. 1h 36m. Starring Tilda Swinton, August Joshi, Carly-Sophia Davies. An artist and her mother confront long-buried secrets when they return to their former family home, now a hotel haunted by the past. Tilda Swinton delivers an exceptional performance in acclaimed filmmaker Joanna Hogg's (*The Souvenir*) latest—a suspenseful exploration of memory and motherhood, presented as a chilling Gothic ghost story.

Tótem (12A)

Dir. Lila Avilés. Mexico, 2023. 1h 35m. Spanish/subs. Starring Naíma Sentíes, Montserrat Marañon, Marisol Gasé. Seven-year-old Sol spends the day at her grandfather's house, helping with preparations for her father's surprise party. As the day goes on, Sol gradually grasps the significance of the celebration. Mexican filmmaker Lila Avilés' (*The Chambermaid*) touching drama unfolds as an emotional portrayal of family upheaval told through the eyes of a child.

Maestro (15)

Dir. Bradley Cooper. USA, 2023. 2h 9m. Starring Bradley Cooper, Carey Mulligan, Matt Bomer. Leonard Bernstein was a titan of the world of classical music. Spanning the years after WWII, this passionate biopic unfolds the tapestry of his life, focusing on his marriage to actress Felicia Montealegre. Led by a pair of stirringly romantic performances, Bradley Cooper pays tribute to one of the preeminent figures in 20th-century American culture.

Fallen Leaves (12A)

Dir. Aki Kaurismäki. Finland, 2023. 1h 21m. Finnish/subs. Starring Alma Pöysti, Martti Suosalo, Alina Tomnikov. In Helsinki, two lonely souls in search of love meet in a local karaoke bar. But their path to happiness is beset by numerous obstacles—from lost phone numbers to mistaken addresses, alcoholism, and even a stray dog. Told with his trademark deadpan humour, Aki Kaurismäki (*Le Harve*) makes a masterful return with this tender tale of star-crossed lovers.

Eileen (15)

Dir. William Oldroyd. UK/USA, 2023. 1h 38m. Starring Thomasin McKenzie, Anne Hathaway, Shea Whigham. In the winter of 1964, Eileen becomes enchanted by the glamorous new counsellor at the prison where she works. However, their friendship takes a dark and unexpected turn. Adapted from Ottessa Moshfegh's award-winning novel, William Oldroyd (*Lady Macbeth*) constructs an atmospheric and intricately twisted tale of obsession.

Napoleon (15)

Dir. Aidley Scott. UK/USA, 2023. 2h 37m. Starring Joaquin Phoenix, Vanessa Kirby, Tahar Rahim, Rupert Everett. Born into Corsican nobility, Napoleon Bonaparte rose through the ranks of the French army to ultimately emerge as the Emperor of France. From the battles which catapulted him to fame to his turbulent marriage to Josephine, Ridley Scott's historical epic offers a glimpse into the psyche of one of the most controversial figures in European history.

Christmas Classic: It's A Wonderful Life (U)

Dir. Frank Capra. USA, 1946. 2h 10m. Starring James Stewart, Donna Reed, Lionel Barrymore. The ultimate Christmas classic on the big screen! Banker George Bailey finds his previously happy life falling apart around him on Christmas Eve and, seeing no way out, considers jumping from the edge of a bridge. However, Clarence, his guardian angel, intervenes and shows George what his beloved hometown of Bedford Falls would be like without him.

Dir. Paul King. UK/USA, 2023. 1h 52m. Starring Timothée Chalamet, Olivia Colman, Hugh Grant, Sally Hawkins. Based on the character at the centre of iconic children's book 'Charlie and the Chocolate Factory', this sweet spin on the story of Willy Wonka reveals how he became the world's most famous chocolatier. The enchanting world of Roald Dahl is bought to musical life by writer-director duo Simon Farnaby and Paul King (*Paddington*).

Anselm (PG)

Dir. Wim Wenders. Germany, 2023. 1h 33m. Filmed over a two-year period, celebrated filmmaker Wim Wenders (*Paris Texas, Wings of Desire, Pina*) presents a stunning portrait of Anselm Kiefer, one of the most innovative artists of our time. Shot using 3D and 6K cameras, this incredibly immersive documentary explores Kiefer's work as well as his fascination with mythology, the human condition, and the cyclical nature of history.

New Year's Day Classic: Amadeus (PG)

Dir. Milos Forman. USA, 1984. 3h. Starring Tom Hulce, F. Murray Abraham, Elizabeth Berridge. In late 18th century Europe, Antonio Salieri is the most famous musician in Vienna. That is, until the arrival of a young Wolfgang Amadeus Mozart. Join us on New Year's Day as we celebrate the 40thanniversary of Miloš Forman's (*One Flew Over the Cuckoo's Nest*) opulent and Oscar-winning tale of a frustrated artist's burning desire for vengeance.
